Honors Advanced Course Requirement

At least four courses of the total 39 units must come from the 5000- level (or higher). These advanced courses may at the same time satisfy the Area Requirement. Before taking any 5000-level class, you should first take at least one 3000-level class in that Area.

Senior Seminar Requirement

PHIL 4010 - Senior Seminar (3)

Students need not wait till their senior year to take this course, though it is aimed at advanced majors. The minimum prerequisites for taking the Senior Seminar are that the student have already completed at least one course from each of Areas I, II, and III, in the Area Requirement table above.

*Note that the Senior Seminar satisfies the University Advanced Writing Requirement.

Elective Requirement

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If meeting the above Area requirements brings your total to 36 units, you need not take any further courses in philosophy. Otherwise, an elective course will be needed to bring the total to 36.

Lower division courses (1000 and 2000 level courses) along with our four religion-oriented courses: PHIL 3610 (Religions of India), PHIL 3620 (Religions of China and Japan), PHIL 3630 (Buddhist Thought), and PHIL 3640 (World Religions) can go towards your Elective Requirement although they do not count towards any specific area philosophy requirements.
